Recreation & Tourism

Swimming Pool... this facility was updated in 2005 and offers a variety of swimming and aquacize lessons! The pool is also available for private bookings.

Campground... this 10 campsite facility is adjacent to the swimming pool and is located on Railway Avenue. Out of the 10 campsites 4 are fully serviced and all sites are filled on a first come-first served basis. There is also an overflow area available for tents. Grounds are open May 1–September 30 and the rate is \$5/night for non-serviced and \$10/night for a fully serviced site.

Memorial Center... this establishment hosts a variety of activities including hockey, figure skating, curling and ringette. During the off season the facility is available to rent for a variety of functions such as family reunions, class reunions, weddings, graduations, etc. There are ball diamonds located adjacent to the facility for residents of all ages to enjoy.

The **Milestone Prairie Players** is an internationally recognized acting group that performs annually at the Milestone Elk's Dinner Theatre.

The **Drop-In Centre** for Seniors was built in 1996 and is open 6 days a week.

There are a variety of recreational sports and activities for residents such as dance lessons, hockey, figure skating, curling, soccer and fitness classes.

There is a selection of different volunteer and service organizations to become involved with in the community. A few of the groups include 4-H, Elks, Prairie Circle, Masons and Moms & Tots.
